Requirements

- 21 years of age or older
- At least 5 years of parenting experience or experience working with children
- Ability to pass background checks (see below)
- Time and ability to meet a child's treatment needs
- A stable living environment
- Financial ability to meet own needs

Home Visits

Throughout the licensing process, a licensing specialist will visit your home in order to:

- Complete SAFE Home Study
- Assess the safety and stability of your home, including all household members
- Answer any questions you may have and assist you with paperwork

Foster Care License

Once you have completed licensing requirements, you will be issued a foster care license and assigned a Family Works social worker, who will assist you with anything you may need pertaining to fostering.

When we receive an appropriate referral for your home, you will receive information about that child to determine if they would be a good fit for your family.
